

## October 2005 Board of Governors Meeting Summary

*Please note: the following summary is based on a draft and preliminary set of minutes from the September 30-October 1, 2005 Board of Governors' (BOG) meeting. The BOG minutes are subject to approval by the BOG at the March 2006 BOG meeting and, accordingly, the following is subject to revisions to correct any errors or changes in the minutes as approved by the BOG.*

- The format for Senior USAT tournaments is now a double 70-meter round in even years and a full FITA in odd years.
- The 12-minute fitness test was eliminated.
- Archers with disabilities may participate in both AR and able-bodied classes with a single registration fee. The score shot will be recorded in both categories. When archers are reassigned targets after the first FITA, qualifying AR archers will be reassigned within the appropriate able-bodied category.
- The NAA will make its best effort to have at least one man and one woman on the staff of training camps and traveling teams.
- The NAA will attempt to schedule USADA presentations at Jr. and Sr. USAT camps, National Target Championships and tournaments where USADA will be testing. This will be to educate archers, coaches and team leaders on drug testing requirements and policies.
- A new contract will be considered for NADA to continue with level 1 and 2 materials.
- The NAA endorsed the curriculum presented by NASP as their Basic Instructor Course in the school program.
- Board structure and composition and committees will be reviewed by an adhoc committee to evaluate the new USOC guidelines
- Adopted a resolution to indemnify the service of Mark Miller for his service with COPANARCO.
- The Board accepted the resignation of Tom Green as Tournament Director for the U.S. National Championship.
- The Board ratified the Executive Committee.

- Pat Madison, Ann Hoyt and Eric Watts were elected to the NAA Foundation Board.
- The Board changed the location of the Southern Indoor Nationals location from Cabarrus County CVB in Concord, N.C. to the Georgia College & State Archery Club in Macon, Ga.
- A Junior Team Trial will be included at the 2006 World Field Championships Trials in Spokane, Wash. The Junior Team will be unfunded.
