## ABOUT PRESCOTT

### Location

Prescott is located in Arizona's central mountains; four mild seasons offer just enough variation to make the weather interesting. Prescott is located 96 miles northwest of Phoenix and 90 miles southwest of Flagstaff, Arizona. Las Vegas is approximately 260 miles to the northwest, the Grand Canyon is an hour and a half drive to the north, and San Diego and Disneyland in Anaheim are within a day's drive. Prescott and the nearby towns of Chino Valley and Prescott Valley form what is known locally as the Tri-City area.

### Climate

Prescott enjoys a four-season climate at an altitude of 5,300 feet above sea level. Typically, the summer temperatures are in the low 90's but can drop to the mid-40's at night. In the winter, daytime highs may vary from the 40's to the 70's, while the nighttime low temperatures can sometimes drop in the teens. Snow flurries and thunderstorms don't generally dominate the weather pattern, but it is advisable to bring a sweater and/or jacket along when traveling in the winter months. Humidity is a moderate 45% year-round. July marks Prescott's monsoon season with cool afternoon thunderstorms.

### History

The discovery of gold in 1838 brought national attention to Prescott, and further discoveries in 1861 drew attention of President Abraham Lincoln. Lincoln was looking for possible sources of funding for the North during the Civil War and created the Arizona territory in 1864. John Goodwin, as the first territorial governor, established Prescott as the first territorial capital. The new governor began the work of laying out the current downtown streets. The Governor's Mansion is now preserved at the Sharlot Hall Museum. The city is named in honor of noted historian William Hickling Prescott and is the seat of government for Yavapai County.

Prescott developed rapidly and in 1865 was described as being built exclusively of wood and inhabited almost entirely by Americans. Both of these facts made it unique among early communities in Arizona. Prescott lost its title as the Capital of Arizona to Tucson and finally to Phoenix in 1889. In 1900 a devastating fire burned Prescott to the ground. Following the fires, most buildings in the downtown area were reconstructed of brick, providing today's rich architectural heritage. Today the older residential streets are lined with tall trees and pitched roof frame houses, including turreted Victorians. Prescott has more than 525 homes and business buildings on the National Register of Historic Places. Its white granite courthouse set among green lawns and spreading trees reflects the Midwestern and New England background of Prescott's early pioneers.

The city has experienced moderate growth since 1975 with the population increasing from 16,888 to 33,938 in 2001. As of July 1, 2001, the city encompasses 38.40 square miles. Dubbed "Everybody's Hometown", Prescott is home to the downtown Courthouse Plaza, famous Whiskey Row, World's Oldest Rodeo, Prescott Fine Arts Association, Sharlot Hall Museum, Phippen Art Museum, Folk Arts Fair, Frontier Days, and Territorial Days. It has been officially designated as "Arizona's Christmas City" by the State of Arizona.

### Recreation and Activities

Recreational opportunities abound in central Yavapai County. Five area lakes within 10 miles of downtown Prescott provide boating and fishing. The 1.2 million-acre Prescott National Forest, which surrounds the city on three sides, contains myriad hiking trails and other outdoor recreational opportunities from backpacking, mountain and street biking, golf, hiking, hunting, horse back riding, shooting and swimming. The Courthouse Plaza, located in the center of the downtown and framed by towering elms, is the focal point for myriad activities, including crafts fairs, antique shows, and art shows.
