Why:	 Learn the essentials to be a confident effective judge and tournament contributor. Sanctioned FITA and USA Archery tournaments and qualifying events require judges. Becoming a judge allows you to help yourself, family, club and FITA target archery and host essential events in your community. There are judging opportunities nationally, in north and south America (COPARCO) and around the world. A judge who works up the ranks, (Candidate, Regional, National, Continental (COPARCO), FITA Candidate and FITA Judge) has an opportunity to judge world championships and the Olympics. Judges are typically paid for their service. The course is a great refresher for existing judges. Coaches and tournament organizers will benefit greatly from current rules knowledge and their application. Introduction to the new rules effect archer, coaches, team leaders and tournament hosts.
