Compound except finger protection per the recurve equipment rules 8.3.1.8 (no release aids 8.3.2.8.1) ***(Scoring: Indoor target face inner 10 ring 10, confirmed by Jane Johnson USAA/NAA National Judge, December 2008)***

Special JOAD note:

During the JOAD National Indoor Championship 600 round, *JOAD Bowmen* and *JOAD Cubs* utilize JOAD target face sizes and scoring criteria:

Recurve Bow- *Cub and Bowman*- 60 cm target face; outer 10 ring scoring.

Compound Bow- *Cub and Bowman* - 40 cm target face use **outer 10 ring scoring.**

During the USA Archery Indoor Championship 2-600 rounds, *JOAD Bowmen* and *JOAD Cubs* utilize FITA scoring. (ie: All use 40cm faces and all compounds use inner 10)

These examples cover most situations.

Applicable FITA rules:

8.6.2.3 When triple faces are used, arrows may be shot in any order, but if more than one arrow is shot into the same scoring area, both (or all) arrows count as part of that end, but only the lowest value arrow will score. The other arrow, or arrows, in the same spot will be scored as a miss, or as misses. Any arrow missing the outermost blue six (6) zone will be scored as a miss.

8.8.2.8 When triple faces are used and more than one arrow is shot into the same scoring area both (or all) arrows count as part of that end but only the lowest value arrow will score (8.6.2.3).
